

Illnesses and their control

It is very important that we control the spread of infection at Pre-school, in the interests of wellbeing for both staff and children, in order to do so we enforce the following exclusion times:

Common cold/Tonsillitis: Management discretion is applied however the child must be deemed as generally well in themselves and happy to be at pre-school.

Diarrhoea and/or vomiting, Gastroenteritis or Food Poisoning: clear of all symptoms for 48hrs since the last loose stool or period of vomiting.

Conjunctivitis: until all signs of infection are clear.

Chicken Pox: 5 days after the onset of blisters and child is well enough in themselves to attend, with the blisters having crusted over.

Whooping cough: 5 days from the commencement of antibiotic treatment, or 21 days from onset if no antibiotics taken.

German measles: 5 days from the onset of a rash.

Measles: 5 days from the onset of a rash.

Hand foot and mouth: until blisters are dry and child's general health is normal.

Mumps: 5 days from the onset of swollen glands.

Impetigo: 48 hours after antibiotic treatment has been started.

Scarlet Fever: 48 hours after commencing antibiotic treatment.

Broken Bones: We request that parents keep their children at home for 48 hours after returning from hospital with a bone break and the application of a plaster cast/ bandages. This enables the cast to set properly and the child to get used the weight and possible balance changes.
